

## Bachelor of Economics 3543 Progression Plan for 2019 Commencing Students

Terminology	Definition
Program compulsory core course and Introductory Business core course	Students must complete ECON1401 as the compulsory core course and choose another 6UOC of Introductory Business core course.
Economics Major	Students must complete at least one major in Economics, Econometrics or Financial Economics consisting of 60UOC. The 60UOC includes 36UOC from the compulsory first and second year core courses. (ACCT1501 and ECON1401 do not count towards a major.) Students must complete at least three (3) level 3 courses (numbered 3XXX).
Economics Elective ; Business School Electives	Economics electives account for 12UOC (2 courses) from the School of Economics to ensure a student completes a minimum of 78UOC of Economics courses within the School of Economics (including one Introductory Business course). Business School electives account for 12UOC (2 courses). Students are free to use these UOC to complete courses from the Business School however they need to be mindful of the program limit on Level 1 courses (60UOC) when making their selection. GEN courses cannot count as Business School electives.
Free Electives	These courses account for 6 courses (36 UOC) to satisfy the degree requirement of 24 courses (144 UOC). These courses may be taken from the Business School or other Faculties within UNSW. GEN coded courses cannot be counted as free electives. You may choose to use these free electives to complete a second Business major or minor, or a minor from other faculties.
General Education	Account for 12UOC (2 courses) and are to be taken outside the UNSW Business School. Please note that students enrolled in programs within the UNSW Business School cannot take General Education courses offered by the UNSW Business School (i.e. GENC code). These restrictions also apply to the following courses: GENL2015 The World of Work; GENL2021 An Introduction to the Australian Legal System; GENL2032 Cyberspace Law 2.0; GENL5021 Business Law Basics.
