why write?**

People write for a lot of reasons. Perhaps you want to express yourself. Perhaps you want to write for profit; you can, and many do, make an excellent living out of writing. Some write to be didactic or to rally people around a cause. Some write for therapy.

**B**

**But I know  
to write**

Write what you know. Write to discover what you know about is to read. Read what you don't know. Read broadly, and read what challenges you. Suzanne Eggins, who teaches professional writing in the School of English at the University of Queensland, agrees. She says if you want to be a professional writer, 'You should be reading voraciously. If you really need to be saturating yourself in writing'. This is true for all forms of writing, be it fiction, non-fiction or journalism, often a hybrid of the two.

If you want to write, you can either write for yourself or you can write for others. Writing for yourself can be incredibly rewarding and highly therapeutic. However, if you want to make a living from writing, you have to write for others. The vast majority of professional writing is non-fiction. If you want to write professionally and make a living, you will probably have to be either a technical or copy-writer,

or you can tread the dangerous path of being a journalist.

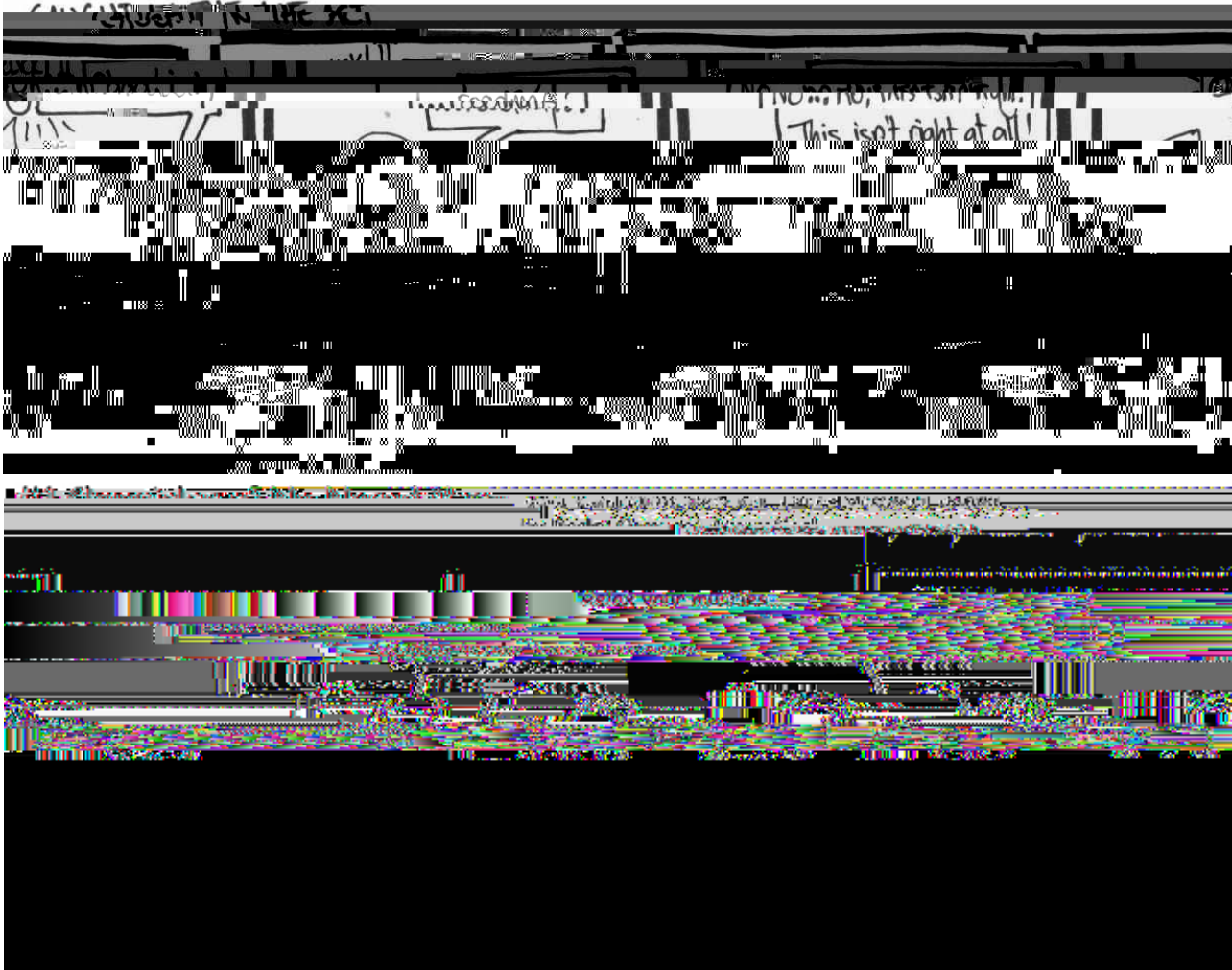
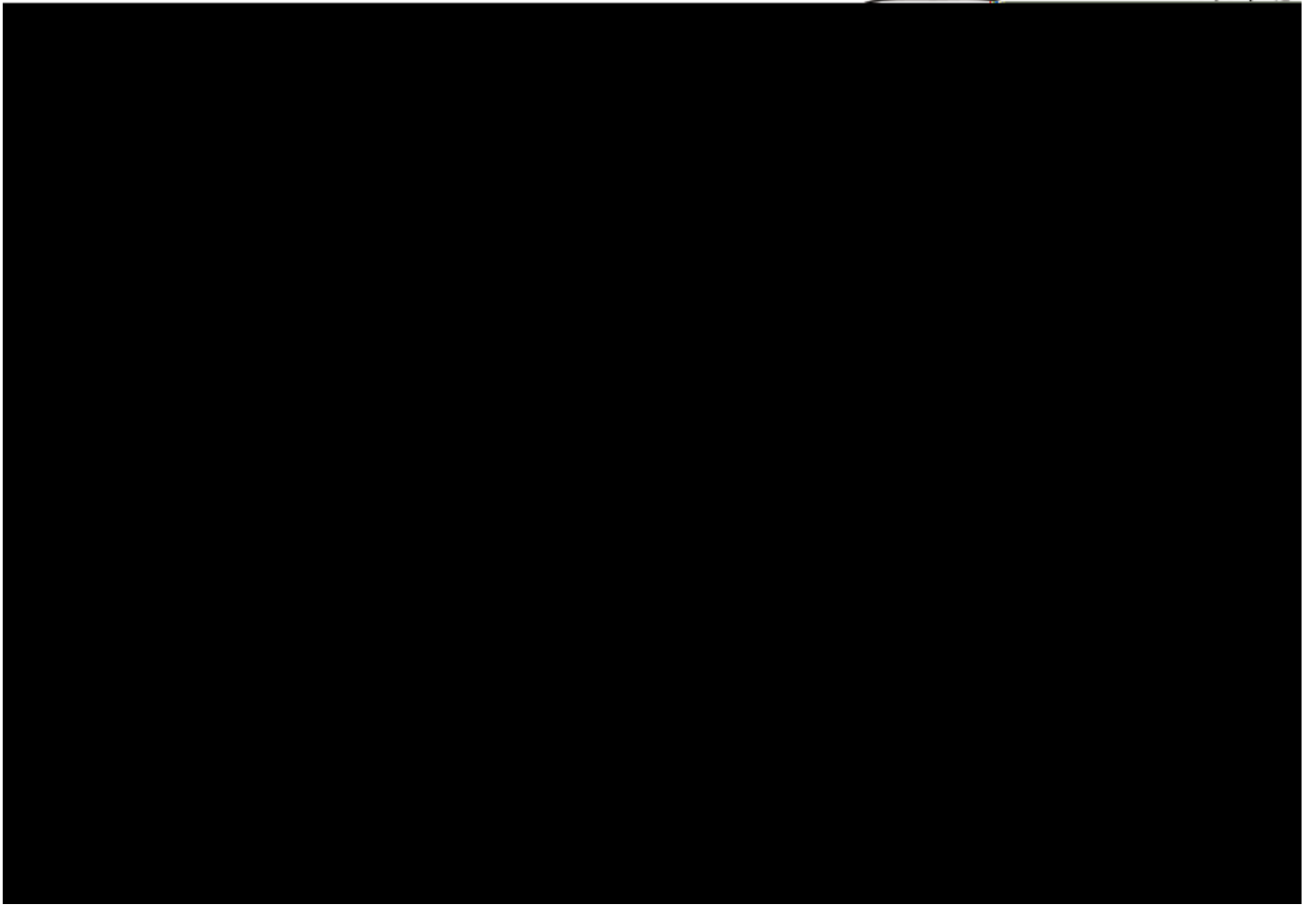

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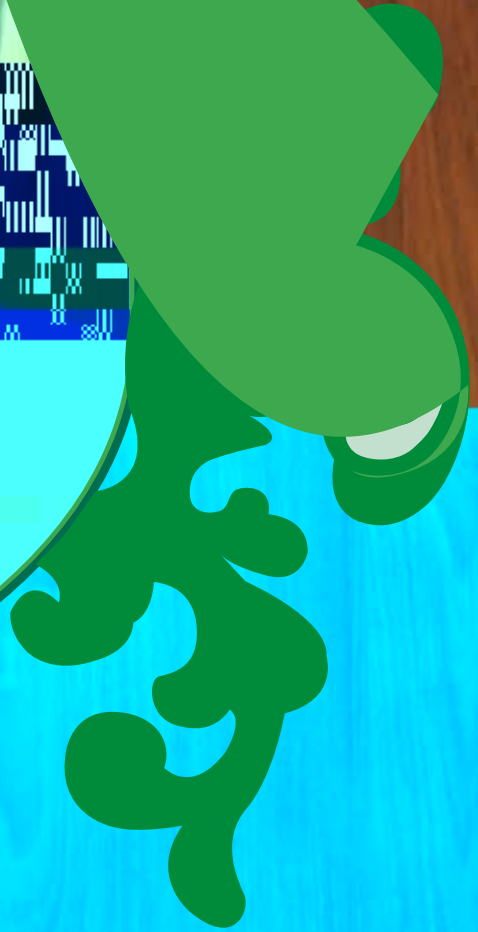
